USCG CAPTAIN OF THE PORT GUAM, ORDER NO. 020-12

Due to hazardous conditions associated with the Tropical Storm 03W, the Captain of the Port has established a limited access area safety zone encompassing all waters of Guam and Rota shoreward of three nautical miles from the baseline, including the Outer Apra Harbor Restricted Navigation Area marked on Apra Harbor chart 81054, the Agana boat basin, the Agat Marina, and the ports of Rota. Ports are to remain closed to all vessel traffic and cargo operations until the US Coast Guard (USCG) has rescinded this order.

Vessels requesting transit through any port or marina within the Captain of the Port zone must first obtain authorization from the Captain of the Port. Any questions or concerns regarding this matter should be forwarded to USCG Sector Guam Command Center at (671) 355-4821.

Failure to comply with this order may, under the provisions of 33 United States Code 1232, subject you to a civil penalty of \$32,500 for each day that the vessel is in violation and/or a criminal penalty of not more than \$50,000 or imprisonment of not more than five (5) years or both. This order is issued without prejudice as of the infraction of civil penalty proceedings for any violations which may have previously occurred.

You may appeal this order in writing within 30 days. Should you be aggrieved by this order, you may, under the procedures as prescribed in 33 CFR 160.7, appeal orally or in writing to the Commander (dp), Fourteenth Coast Guard District, 300 Ala Moana Blvd, 9th Floor, Honolulu, HI 96850-4982. However, if the initial appeal is made orally, a written submission is required within (5) five days of the oral presentation. While any request or appeal is pending, all provisions of this order remain in effect.
