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**MINUTES OF THE
REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
Tuesday, October 30, 2018**

I. CALL TO ORDER

There being a quorum, the regular meeting of the Board of Directors was called to order at 11:50 a.m., Tuesday, October 30, 2018. Present at the meeting were:

Absent were Mr. Francisco G. Santos, Board Chairman. Also present was Eun Sung Corporation-Gary Yang; AM Insurance-Angelica Perez, Guam Post-Loella Losina; Pacific Daily News-Anumita Kaur and Port Management staff.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

a. **September 26, 2018 – Regular Board Meeting:** Director Taitano made motion to approve the minutes of September 26, 2018 subject to correction. The motion was seconded by Director Mendiola and was unanimously passed.

III. PUBLIC COMMENTS

- a. **Public Comments:** None.
- b. **Employee Comments:** None.
- c. **PAGGMA Association:** PAGGMA Secretary BettyAnn Wusstig-Perez mentioned that a financial report on the Port Week funds will be prepared and submitted to the Finance division upon completion of the port week activities. Also, the association will be holding its Christmas Party for its members on December 1, 2018 at the Nikko Hotel.

IV. GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

The General Manager's report was provided for Board's information. The following key item(s) are noted as follows:

1. **Typhoon Yutu:** Governor Eddie Calvo through Executive Order No. 2019-01 on October 24, 2018, declared a state of emergency in order to anticipate and alleviate impacts to Guam arising from the approach of Typhoon Yutu. In preparation, port management secured the offices, port officials, port equipment and various cargos. Condition of Readiness 4 was declared on October 25, 2018 at 10am. The Port overall fared well with the aftermath of the typhoon and began servicing vessels on October 26.

2. **Public Law 34-133 Video Teleconferencing at Meetings of Government Boards and Commissions:** Public Law 34-133 was enacted on October 17, 2018 relative to allowing the use of video teleconferencing applications at meetings of government boards and commissions to guarantee a quorum, for convenience, and to expand the eligibility of membership to those community members that may be homebound; and encouraging the use of video live streaming at meetings in order to increase transparency in government.

3. **Public Law 34-112 Guam Customs and Quarantine Granted four (4) Acres of Parcel 1-3:** Public Law 34-112 was enacted on July 17, 2018 which is an act that grants administrative jurisdiction of a four (4) acre portion of parcel 1-3 in the municipality of Piti, as shown on map 055FY2014, to the Guam Customs and Quarantine (GCQA). Purpose of the property transfer is for GCQA to develop and construct a customs satellite inspection, holding and secured sterile facility area. The law further provides that if the property is not developed into a functional facility within three years, administrative jurisdiction of GCQA shall expire and the property shall revert to the Government of Guam.

4. **Revenue Bond Report:** Management met with Citigroup representatives on October 10, 2018 to discuss and review the Port's \$71,445,000 revenue bond. The contents of the report includes summary of orders and amendments, marketing efforts, market recap, buyers by maturity, pricing wires, official statement cover, rating report, final numbers, closing wire instructions and the distribution list.

5. **Port Week: 43 Years of Service to Guam and the Region:** The Port Week kicked off its Opening Ceremony on October 15, 2018 celebrating 43 years of service to Guam and the Region. A flag raising ceremony and parade of tractors were performed during the event. The Grand Finale took place on October 19, 2018 with award recognitions made to port employees. In celebration of port week, the employees took part in bowling, volleyball, basketball, tractor pull, softball, ping-pong, golf, shooting range, karaoke contest and billiards tournament.

6. **Port Authority of Guam 2018 MagPRO Award Winners:** Port employees were selected winners in the respective categories: *Behind the Scenes*-PWC Jacqueline Cruz; *Employee of the Year*-Planner IV Donna Lizama-Acosta, Cargo Checker Antony Leon Guerrero,

PWC Maria Llanes, and Carpenter II Luis Diaz; *Supervisor of the Year*-Vessel Planner Janice Flores, Stevedore Leader Gilbert Santos, Facility Building Maintenance Leader Vester Lagaras; *Lifesaving Medal*-Assistant Port Police Chief Christopher Roberto; *Employee Association of the Year*-PAGGMA. The MagPRO Awards dinner was held on October 26, 2018 at the UOG Fieldhouse. The Port Authority served as a Silver Sponsor for this event.

V. OLD BUSINESS

1. **Formulation of Board Committee:** Tabled, until the next meeting.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

1. **Ratification of Resolution No. 2018-08 thru Resolution No. 2018-12:** Director Taitano made motion to ratify Resolution No. 2018-08 thru Resolution No. 2018-12 relative to commending and congratulating Port retirees on their retirement from the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port, seconded by Director Taimanglo. Motion was unanimously approved.

2. **Harbor of Safe Refuge – Marina Drive Repair:** By way of background, the access road to the Harbor of Safe Refuge is in terrible condition and has deteriorated over time. The impacted road is under the jurisdiction of the Guam Power Authority (GPA) and the adjacent properties, Harbor of Safe Refuge, is that of the Port Authority. The road then became a shared access for both GPA and the Port, having the bulk of vehicular traffic by port tenants. Mr. Alfred F. Duenas, Deputy General Manager of Admin/Finance (DGMA) mentioned that in an effort to restore the road, the Port and GPA would share the cost to address the condition of the shared access. The projected cost is \$283,000.00, having the Port share at \$142,000.00. The DGMA requested for Board approval for management to allocate funds for this project through the Small Projects account and authorize management to enter into an agreement with GPA for this purpose.

Director Taimanglo made motion to authorize management to allocate funds in the amount of \$142,000.00 through the Small Projects account for the Harbor of Safe Refuge access road project as well as enter into an agreement with Guam Power Authority. Motion was seconded by Director Taitano and was unanimously approved.

3. **Coin-Operated Pressure Wash Machine:** The DGMA mentioned that a coin-operated pressure wash machine has been installed at the Hagatna Marina for reasons of accountability and cost recapturing on water consumption. He requested for Board approval for management to adopt a proposed fee of \$1.00 for four minutes of operation, with each additional minute at \$0.25. Converted to consumption, it will be 4 gallons at 4 minutes totals 16 gallons per operation; with 4 gallons for each additional minute, if necessary. The DGMA mentioned that 16 gallons is sufficient to washdown a 12-foot boat; however for larger boats would probably need the additional minutes. He expressed that the pressure wash machine is specifically to rinse-off salt from boats and trailers, not a carwash operation. A signage will be posted in the area with instructional use and requirements. Also, as a safeguard to the machine, a security camera of the area is in place which is owned by a port tenant that has allowed port access.

Director Mendiola made motion to adopt the proposed fee of \$1.00 for the use of the newly installed coin-operated washdown at the Gregorio D. Perez Marina, seconded by Director Taitano. Motion was unanimously approved.

The General Manager informed the Board that the proposed fee is an interim rate enabled by the Port's terminal tariff for a period of six months and by the end of this period management will have petitioned the Public Utilities Commission to determine actual cost.

4. **Association of Pacific Ports Sponsorship:** As a member of the Association of Pacific Ports, request is being made to sponsor the Lieutenant Level providing transportation for networking outings at \$1,000.00 for the 2019 APP Winter Conference on January 23-25, 2019, Ka'anapali Lahaina, Hawaii. Funds are supported through the General Manager's Miscellaneous account.

Director Mendiola made motion to authorize the sponsorship of the Lieutenant Level in the amount of \$1,000.00 for the Association of Pacific Ports 2019 Winter Conference on January 23-25, 2019 in Hawaii. Motion was seconded by Director Taimanglo and was unanimously approved.

5. **Travel Authorization Request:**

a. **Premier Worker's Compensation Certification Program, November 12-16, 2018, Chicago, Illinois:** The DGMA mentioned that the Port has experienced cases with workers compensation in terms of the laws, rules and regulations and would be advantageous for the Port to develop the expertise of this field in the Safety division. He mentioned this is an opportunity for staff to gain the training and certification of the workers compensation program, workers compensation insurance, and would have possess the knowledge when working with Department of Labor. Director Taitano asked for the number of worker's comp cases with the Port. Without objections, Safety Officer II Joshua Candoleta replied that the Port currently has six active cases, four potential cases and two long-term workers comp cases. Director Mendiola inquired whether the Port currently has a certified personnel in this field. The General Manager stated not within the Port, but guidance is sought through with the Department of Labor for the government of Guam. Director Mendiola suggested that upon completion of the certification program, a safety briefing and best practices be presented to the Port managers.

Director Taitano made motion to approve the travel authorization request for Mr. Joshua Candoleta, Safety Officer II to attend or as otherwise designated by the General Manager, seconded by Director Mendiola. Motion was unanimously approved.

b. **PAG Bond Update Meeting, December 10-13, 2018, San Francisco, California:** Director Mendiola made motion to approve the travel authorization request as presented or as otherwise designated by the General Manager. The motion was seconded by Director Taimanglo and was unanimously approved.

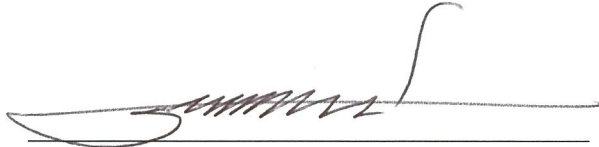
VII. ADJOURNMENT

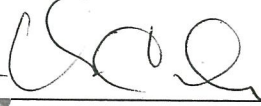

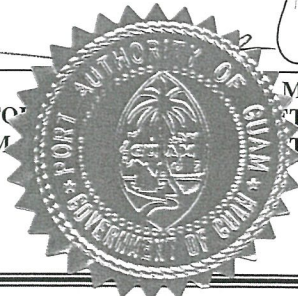

Executive Summary

**Request for Proposal PAG-018-003
Independent Auditing Services**

PURPOSE: Request the Board of Directors to approve the contract award to Deloitte & Touche, LLP pursuant to RFP-018-003 to provide Auditing Services for the Port Authority of Guam (PAG).

BACKGROUND:

On Wednesday, August 15, 2018, a Request for Proposal (RFP) was issued to solicit qualified companies/firms to provide professional services for the Independent Audit Services at the Port Authority of Guam by advertising a public notice through the Guam Daily Post and the Office of the Public Auditor (OPA) website. The deadline to submit for the proposals was on November 7, 2018. Five (5) firms have showed interest by registering and downloading the package on the OPA website. Three (3) firms officially submitted their response to the RFP.

The bid opening was on Friday, November 7, 2018. After the opening of all the bid submittals along with their sealed proposals and determining that all Offerors were responsible, the proposals were distributed and evaluated by the evaluation committee. The results of the evaluation committee revealed Deloitte & Touche, LLP as the highest ranked offeror and most qualified. The evaluation process was under the guidance and in collaboration with the OPA and The PAG Evaluation Committee.

As part of the RFP procurement process, a letter of Notice of Intent to Award was sent on Tuesday, October 16, 2018, and then formed a Cost Negotiation Committee to open Deloitte & Touche, LLP sealed proposals to begin the cost negotiation proceedings.

The first cost negotiation began on Friday, October 26, 2018 and proceeding to open Deloitte sealed proposal. To effectuate this contract, a letter dated November 7, 2018 as the initial 1st counter offer from the Port. Mr. Lee Vensel, Partner from Deloitte & Touche, LLP responded on November 6, 2018, countering the Port. After various meetings with the Cost Negotiation Committee and Procurement, a teleconference meeting between the offeror and the Port was held on November 15, 2018. Subsequent to the final negotiations meeting, a letter was sent to Deloitte on November 16, 2018.

On November 16, 2018 Deloitte & Touche, LLP officially accepted the Port's Final Counter Offer. ***Both parties have come to a fair and reasonable negotiation.***

LEGAL REVIEW:

Upon the General Manager's and Board of Directors approval of negotiated rates a draft contract will be sent to the Port's SAAG for contract approval as to form.

FINANCIAL REVIEW:

Funding for the contract is made possible through the Operations and Maintenance General Funds.

RECOMMENDATION:

Management request the Board of Directors' motion to approve the award for the Annual Independent Auditing Services contract in the amount of **\$45,000.00 for FY2018, and \$49,000.00 for FY2019 & FY2020, respectively** to Deloitte & Touche, LLP. Deloitte & Touche, LLP has been determined to have met all the requirements set forth in the RFP and is consistent with the Guam Procurement Regulations.
