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PORT ENTRY PROCEDURE FOR APRA HARBOR, GUAM

- 1. All vessels must submit the *Small Vessel Notice of Arrival* for vessel accommodations 96 hours prior to arrival to the Harbor Master's Office via email.
- 2. **All vessels** must obtain permission from Guam Harbor Control on VHF Channel 13 or via landline before entering, departing, or shifting within Guam waters.
- 3. Vessels bound for the Marinas must contact the Port Authority of Guam's **Commercial Division** and obtain an approved permit prior to arrival.
- 4. Vessels entering Apra Harbor proceeding to the Special Anchorage area or Marianas Yacht Club must contact the Port Authority of Guam's **Harbor Master's Office**, and may **only transit during daylight hours**.
- 5. After receiving permission to enter Apra Harbor, vessels will proceed to Special Anchorage, located southeast of Seaplane Ramp, to the following coordinates: 13° 27.73' North 144° 39.65' East
- 6. All persons will remain onboard until local authorities (Guam Customs & Quarantine and U.S. Customs & Border Protection) arrive. Only upon the arrival of authorities may you proceed to shore using your dinghy or small boat.
- 7. Once cleared by the authorities, proceed to the Port Authority of Guam's Finance office, located on the first floor of the Port of Guam Administrative Building, to pay any applicable fees. Once finished, you may return to your vessel.

It is the responsibility of the owner/operator to make necessary accommodations with Marianas Yacht Club before arrival. If no accommodations are made with Marianas Yacht Club, vessels are to remain at the Special Anchorage location.

Any vessel staying more than sixty (60) days must be registered with the Guam Police Department – Maritime Division.
